


#### From PPWP, Geoff Middlehurst:



#### **QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:**

**Q** - Does the Auxiliary Auditor have the right to make changes in the Ledgers and can he/she add items into the Accounts?

**A** - It is the duty of the Auditor to exam and Audit the books and records for the purpose of ascertaining whether the books and records are in order. The Auditor should inform the person who made the mistake of what their mistake was, then oversee and approve that person making the needed changes to his/her books. If the person who made the mistake refuses to make the needed changes, then the President should be informed, as the President is responsible for enforcing the Laws of the Order. The person responsible for the books should make the needed changes, not the Auditor. By the person who is responsible for the books making the changes, it will help them to better understand why the change is necessary. **Sections 21.2, 21.3 and 21.4**; of the Rules and Regulations, page 40 explains what the duties of an Auditor are.

#### **Continued From QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS:**

- **Q** Does a re-enrolled applicant have to Interviewed and Balloted on?
- A Yes, **Section 1.6** of the Rules and Regulations state in part; <u>All applications for Membership</u>, submitted by the applicant, shall, after having been read to the Auxiliary Membership, <u>be referred to the Interviewing Committee</u>. Section 1.8 of the Rules and Regulations state; Any former member of an Auxiliary is eligible to apply for re-enrolled membership in any Auxiliary and applicants for re-enrollment <u>must be voted on by secret ballot</u>. Section 1.8 (b) of the Rules and Regulations state; <u>Re-enrolled members need not be re-initiated</u>.
- **Q** What would happen if a Madam President resigns her Office and the Vice President does not feel that she is ready to move into the Station of Madam President?
- A Section 9.2 (a) of the Rules and Regulations states; If a vacancy occurs in the office of the Junior Madam President, the same shall be filled by appointment by the Madam President from among the Past Madam Presidents of that Auxiliary. If a vacancy occurs in any other elective office, except Madam President and Madam Vice President, the Auxiliary shall decide, by a majority vote of those present in regular meeting, the manner in which such vacancy shall be filled. Section 19.1 (b) of the Rules and Regulations states: If a vacancy occurs in the office of the Madam President, the Madam Vice President shall succeed to the office of Madam Vice President shall be declared vacant.

According to Grand Aerie Secretary, Charles Cunningham; It is the duty of the Madam Vice President to assume the office of the Madam President if a vacancy occurs in that office. If the Madam Vice President does not wish to assume that office, she would have to resign and an election would have to be held to fill both the Madam President and Madam Vice Presidents offices.

**Q** - If someone belongs to Victory what is the procedure for them to transfer to another Auxiliary? **A** - Any member wishing to transfer out of the Victory Auxiliary to another Auxiliary should go to the Auxiliary that they wish to transfer to and apply for transfer. The Secretary there can initiate an electronic transfer through the MMS as long as the dues are current and Grand will acknowledge the request. Once accepted there, the transfer will be completed by the MMS system. This answer was also doubled checked with and confirmed by the Grand Aerie Secretary Charles Cunningham.

#### PARLIAMENTARY CORNER

There have been a number of questions that I was asked both at, and since getting back from, Convention, and I thought I would include their answers here as points of information for those who also may have encountered them in their Aerie meetings, either theoretically or actually.

Here follows three things that Worthy Presidents should know in regard to parliamentary procedure:

#### The "Head-'Em-Off-At-The-Pass" Motion

No member may make a motion for the purpose of speaking against its recommendation(s). This has been a commonly-tried tactic by those who have already considered an idea to be bad, assume that a motion is forthcoming to adopt it, and therefore seek to "Head-'Em-Off-At-The-Pass" by gaining the floor to speak against it. Such individuals tend to be control fanatics who, in reality, have a need to continue (or gain) some influence over the membership.

If it becomes obvious that the Brother who made the motion is actually speaking against it (or any of its details) then the Worthy President should declare that Brother out of order immediately and ask the assembly if there is anything else to be discussed under the question. In a nutshell: if you want to speak against a motion, let someone else make it.

#### The "Seconding" of Motions

Based upon parliamentary procedure (of which Robert's Rules of Order is the 'bible', if you will) any motion coming from a committee does not require a second. The seconding of a committee's motion is both assumed and proper, and unless you have it in your By-Laws that a specific second is required for all motions, the

At this point the Worthy President declares the motion moved and seconded, then moves on to the question where discussion occurs. However, if a motion has come from a Brother who is not speaking on behalf of any committee of which he is a member, then another Brother must rise and directly second the motion before discussion can occur.

#### The "Tabling" of Motions

I was asked recently "Is there a difference between 'tabling' a motion and 'laying a motion on the table'?" The answer is no: 'to table' is merely a more abbreviated way to say 'lay on the table'. Several common questions have arisen lately in regard to tabling motions, and I'll detail them now:

The flaw in tabling motions is that the majority (through their vote) has the power to halt the consideration of a question immediately and without debate. In some assemblies, this may properly and legally occur. In our Aerie meetings, however, the Worthy President is more than just the chair: he also represents Equality, and therefore in good conscience may not allow a motion to be tabled, except for a very good reason, simply because tabling violates the right of the minority to be heard on an issue. And consider the complexity required to reverse a tabled motion: it takes a mere majority vote (51% or better) to table a motion, but it requires a 2/3 vote to take a motion back 'from the table'.

Add to this that no Brother may move to table a motion if the intent is to avoid or kill the recommendation(s) included in the motion (many have tried this tactic to prevent a decision on a particular topic). The act of tabling, if done for this reason, is out of order, and the Worthy President should permit motions to be laid on the table ONLY if another more important issue of business must be decided immediately instead. So, unless a motion to table is entertained because another motion is made to get a bucket of water due to the fact that the Junior Past's hair is on fire, the Worthy President should seek clarification of the reason for tabling a motion before he permits it.

There is an easy way around any confusion regarding 'tabling'. What most Brothers mean to do by tabling a motion is to wait until further or all information has been gathered so that the most informed decision can be made. If this is the case, then tabling the motion does not apply. In such cases, the correct motion would be one to 'Postpone' the motion until some specified future date/time, and the Brother Secretary makes a note to revisit that motion under Unfinished Business at that specified future meeting, where the information can be presented and worthwhile discussion of the motion can then take place.

The best way to avoid any potential conflicts is for the Brothers to be sure they say 'table' when they *mean* 'table' (which would be perhaps 1% of the time) and say 'postpone' when they *mean* 'postpone'.

Postponed motions have particulars, such as minuted dates and times, which will lead to a motion's discussion and final decision. However, Aeries all over North America have had motions tabled that were never heard about again. It is too convenient to table a motion and have it slip through the cracks forever, from meeting to meeting, term after term, and as long as those wishing to prevent the motion maintain a mere 35% of the assembly to vote against taking the motion from the table, the motion can stay in parliamentary limbo indefinitely. In such cases, however, Brothers should rise under a Point of Order to question the tabling of any motion, and the Worthy President should rule each motion to table as out of order if there is no more important issue of business that can be judged to take immediate precedence.

#### **Continued From PARLIAMENTARY CORNER**

Motions tabled in error can be reinstated immediately to active status by a Brother claiming a 'Right of Privilege' and asking that the motion to table be re-read as it was recorded. If the motion to table did not detail a valid issue of immediate importance, the motion to table is ruled out of order and the original motion becomes the current motion which can then correctly be 'postponed' (if the need still exists).

In conclusion, it's best to avoid tabling motions; it probably isn't what you meant to do, and it probably isn't what you meant to say. Use 'I move to postpone' instead, and Aerie business will be completed properly and with dispatch.
