


#### F.O.E. EAGLE RIDERS 3097 CAMPBELL RIVER



Hello Brothers, As we head into the second half of the term and the brand new year of 2020, we're making good progress in Membership, expanding our marquee status in our Communities and doing that good and noble work for our worthy and charitable causes. For any Aeries that want to host a Convention for 2022 or beyond (2020's will be held in Cranbrook, and 2021's will be in Hope), please refer to the Provincial By-Laws for the process. If there are any proposed By-Law amendments afoot this term so please forward your proposals to By-Laws Chairman Wayne Bucklage or me for their circulation to all the Aeries in B.C.; those that have been derived so far will be forwarded to all Local Aerie Secretaries in the Province. When they come to your meeting floors for discussion the Worthy President is responsible for making sure the Aeries' decisions on the amendments are known to the delegates so that they can vote that way at the upcoming Convention.

This term's Cursory Audits are being performed in all Local Aeries by spring; please remember that we perform these to help Aeries get back on track so that all duties of Aeries Officers are in compliance with our Statutory and Constitutional definitions. The changes, upgrades and improvements made at the 2019 Grand Convention are further steps to clarify and emphasize the importance of the simple structures the Statutes contain. If I am asked anything the most often it is regarding why each Aerie cannot be allowed to manage its own business in the manner that its officers decide. My answer has always been that Aeries may certainly manage themselves in whatever manner they see fit, but the Statutes are there to define how Aeries record their business, so that all Aeries produce the same information.

All Aeries should have their books be in the same format so that details can be checked easily and in the same manner in every Aerie. Reports should be on file so that from one term to the next new Officers can track what their predecessors have done. Printed reports are useful to the current Officers and are the only form that Aerie Auditors can examine. A profit-and-loss report in one Aerie should contain the same information in one Aerie as it does in the next. The Statutes, therefore, are about standardization more than anything else, and are designed to guarantee that minutes, reports and cash books are all in printed form for ease of scrutiny by any Aerie member when they ask to see them; they have the same rights as members as we do, and we all need to represent our Constitution just as our Obligation and our annual Oaths as Officers require us to do. I have personally always viewed it this way: if the Aerie's Executive knows the "rules", jumps through the little "hoops" that the rules require from us, then the result is that the Executive as a whole keeps the Aerie Charter on the wall all other concerns and details can be worked out and handled. Never letting the Charter become at risk is the most important job of every Executive in every Aerie everywhere. Executive members keep that Charter on the wall, handle all the formal stuff, and the membership is free to adapt and invent and succeed. In a nutshell, we do the formal stuff so that members don't have to.

The final – and best – word on the Constitution: the 2019 edition of the Constitution and Statutes is now available from the Grand Aerie Supplies Department. In bold text, all of the changes appear that were made at the 2017, 2018, and 2019 Grand Conventions, inclusive. Copies are available at \$6.00 each, and all Local Secretaries are recommended to order in copies for all current officers of their Aerie.

New resources this year include electronic version of both the Aerie Auditor's Monthly and Annual Reports. For events coming up, the Provincial Executive Teleconference is coming up in January, and our Spring Executive Session is scheduled for March in Abbotsford #2726.





## Fraternal Order of Eagles British Columbia Provincial Auxiliary Hall of Fame

#### **PURPOSE:**

This Hall of Fame is dedicated to provide honour and recognition to those members of the local Auxiliaries of the British Columbia Provincial Auxiliary, Fraternal Order of Eagles, who have provided the leadership, stability, knowledge, time and effort in the advancement of membership, programs, activities and the general ideals of this order throughout the Province of British Columbia.

The Hall of Fame is not meant to replace the Woman of the Year honour that is given for local service. It is to honour those that are serving, or have served, this Provincial Auxiliary.

## **QUALIFICATIONS:**

Nominee must have been an Auxiliary member for a minimum of twelve (12) years continuous membership with her home Auxiliary located in the Province of British Columbia.

Nominee must be in good standing in her Auxiliary.

Nominee must be at least thirty-three (33) years of age.

Nominee should have been, or still be. Active in her local Auxiliary as well as Zone and/or the Province.

## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Applications to be submitted by local Auxiliaries on the application form attached. Applications must contain all facts and dates of service to assist the committee in their selections. Applications may be submitted by an Auxiliary, signed and sealed by the Madam President and the Madam Secretary. They may also be submitted by at least two (2) Past Provincial Madam Presidents or two (2) Hall of Fame members, and signed by these proposers.

There will be four (4) selections with no more than two (2) being deceased.

Applications shall be submitted to the Chairman of the committee prior to the deadline of May 1<sup>st</sup> to be considered for presentation at the Provincial Convention. Applications will be held for a period of three (3) years with automatic reviewing each year.

#### **ADMINISTRATION:**

The Provincial Madam President shall appoint the Hall of Fame committee from the Past Provincial Madam Presidents and the Hall of Fame members.

## **RITUAL RULES**

- 1. No member may occupy the same station in their Class for more than two (2) consecutive years.
- 2. The Sister who does One Woman may also compete on another Team.
- 3. A Sister <u>may not</u> Judge the same Class as she is competing in.
- 4. Class "D" is Sitting Officers only **no exceptions**
- 5. A list of all competing Officers and their Stations <u>plus an alternate</u> in case of an emergency for all Classes except Class "D" shall be written on the Entry Forms and returned to the Provincial Ritual Chairman by <u>January 30<sup>th</sup></u> of the competing year.
- 6. Each Auxiliary shall be allowed to enter as many Teams as they desire plus the One Woman Ritual.
- 7. All Participants <u>must have their Official Receipt to enter Competition.</u>
- 8. The Receipt <u>must be on display for Inspection</u>, then <u>must be left in the Anteroom and Simulation</u> used for Competition.
- 9. The Official Receipt of the Secretary <u>must be produced and inspected</u> in the Opening Ceremony <u>not simulated</u> whether Secretary is furnished by the Ritual Committee or the Competing Team.
- 10. Candles **must not** be used in Competition.
- 11. If competitor has any Speech Impediment or Physical Handicap please notify the Chairman prior to Inspection. This should be marked on the Exemption Sheet.
- 12. **Prompt** consists of three (3) words and will cost the competing Member one-half (1/2) of a point. If further prompt is needed it will be given by one word at a time with one-tenth (1/10) of a point for each additional word given.
- 13. A Member of a Competing Team; may, if so desired watch any Team, even one in the same Class as they are competing in if they wish to do so, **before they compete.**
- 14. Special attention should be paid to Punctuation, Expression and Salutation Signs. Check the small print in your Ritual.
- 15. The Inside Guard is no longer an Official Member of the Competing Team. She still must enter or exit her Station correctly. She must return to her Station before she addresses the Madam President or Madam Vice President.

- 16. Competing Member who turns Lights on must turn them off. In the Initiatory, Madam Conductor in preparing the room will signify (example: hand motion) for the Officer to turn on her light (Jr. Past, etc) and that Officer will then turn on her light as she must turn it off at the conclusion of her Charge.
- 17. <u>FLAG</u> must always be on the side of the entrance door to the Ritual Room and <u>MUST</u> be carried as per small print in the Ritual Book.
- 18. If there is an Eagle on the Staff, the Eagle must face the President at all times.

- 19. **ALL TEAMS** will be charged in Provincial Competition if the Flag is not saluted when necessary.
- 20. If the Flag is on the left of the Altar the Junior Past must salute in the Opening Ceremony when she approaches the Altar to demonstrate the Salutation and Voting Signs, and again in the Closing Ceremony when she is instructed to approach the Altar unless she squares the room (leaves her Station and goes to the Vice Presidents Station and up the center to the Altar)
- 21. If the Flag is on the Chaplain's side of the Altar then she must salute the Flag when approaching the Altar for the Opening Prayer, Initiation Prayer and Closing Prayer unless she squares the room (leaves her Station and goes to the Vice Presidents Station and up the center to the Altar)
- 22. Conductor must salute the Flag when approaching or leaving the Altar or when leaving the room (unless she squares the room)
- 23. There will be three Judges for Drill Team.
- 24. Ritual Trophies are to be engraved by the winning Teams at their expense.
- 25. Judges must be made aware of all Rules pertaining to Judging Entering and Exiting of Stations, Salutations etc.
- 26. Stations must always be entered on the left and vacated on the right side (with the exception of the One Woman Ritual). This applies to <u>all five</u> Members of the Team and the Inside Guard.
- 27. Competing Teams should report fifteen (15) minutes before going on the floor.
- 28. <u>All</u> adjustments of dresses and Regalia, including positioning of Ritual Team and/or Drill Team must be done in the anteroom prior to Inspection. An individual may turn her Regalia over before Inspection.
- 29. A sample of the Score Sheet, fully explaining calculations method required, to be attached to the Provincial Ritual Chairman's briefcase.
- 30. Classes "A", "B", "B3", "C", "D", "E" "Novice" and "One Woman" will supply six (6) up to date <u>New Rituals</u> for Competition. One Ritual will be used as the <u>Master</u>
- 31. Auxiliary must notify Ritual Chairman as soon as possible if unable to compete at given time.
- 32. No Ritual Books, other than the Judges, will be allowed in the Hall except for Novice Class.
- 33. Spectators **must not talk** or cause any disturbance or they will be asked to leave.
- 34. No one will be permitted to enter a Competition Room after a Team has started the Ritual.

- 35. Expenses for Provincial Judges to judge any entry Provincially at their Zone will be paid out of funds allowed to the Provincial Ritual Chairman.

- 36. The entry fee is thirty five (\$35.00) per entry Per Team regardless of the number of Entries from an Auxiliary.
- 37. Judges will not be allowed in the Tally Room while Tallying is being done.

- 38. All Official Receipts will be checked at the door when entering the Ritual Room to watch competitions.
- 39. Time will start from the first person to enter Ritual Hall to last person leaving the Hall.
- 40. All Teams, with the exception of Novice, "A" Class and One Woman <u>must obtain a score of 94.5%</u> in order to receive a Provincial Trophy.
- 41. If you are the only competing Team in your Class **you must reach** a score of 94.5% or higher.
- 42. You are to have five (5) Judges.
- 43. After the Madam Chaplain has given a Prayer and ends with "Amen" Chaplain <u>WILL NOT</u> repeat the word "Amen" even though it is printed in the Ritual Book. <u>"ALL OTHER TEAM MEMBERS</u> MUST SAY AMEN".
- 44. Judges <u>ARE NOT</u> to discuss the performance, the judging or the results with anyone whatsoever; this includes Tallyers.
- 45. No pins or tags permitted on apparel (check for possible exceptions).

#### ONE WOMAN RITUAL RULES

- 1. A Conductor (Phantom) will be allowed to assist in setting up the Altar in the Opening Ceremony, but must then immediately return to the Chair designated for her.
- 2. Glass of water at the President's Station is acceptable and may be used.
- 3. Competing Officer <u>must specify in writing</u> to the Official or Designate at the time of competition a Standing-Sitting action or Hand Motion movement to signify movement of the other Officers, <u>but must be consistent</u>. Indication of Officers walking may be done by eye movement.
- 4. Competing Officer may move from One Station to the other in the Initiation Ceremony if desired, however she must enter the Station on the left and leave the Station on the left.
- 5. Competing Officer must leave President's Station in the Initiation as stated in the Ritual, in the usual manner.
- 6. Competitor **must wear one** Regalia only, that of the Madam President.
- 7. Phantom Conductor does not wear Regalia.

- 8. The competing member <u>must</u> dismantle the Altar at the close of the meeting. <u>Simulation must not</u> be used. She <u>must</u> dismantle in the same order as the Altar was set up, FLAG, BIBLE and then the MOTHER HEAD.
- 9. There will be five Judges for Competition three on text, two on mechanics.
- 10. Competitors must supply six (6) **new** up to date Ritual Books.

- 11. After Inspection has been completed, Competitor must retire to anteroom and re-enter the Hall.
- 12. <u>Immediately following Inspection of Competitor, the Phantom Conductor must assume</u> her Station. Phantom Conductor is not Inspected.
- 13. Competitor may enter as many years as she wishes to but once she wins the Provincial Trophy; with or without other Competitors, and re-enters the following year, **she must better** her previous score if she has no competition the second year (the only competitor).

## **NOVICE TEAM RITUAL RULES**

- 1. Team <u>may use their Ritual Books if they desire</u> however they must know the Ritual and be able to present it with Expression and Dignity.
- 2. Team must know Floor Routine and Signs correctly.
- 3. A Team may compete for two (2) years only **then must move up to next Level** of Competition (Regular Competition)
- 4. <u>Once winning in Novice a Team must enter into Regular Competition</u> even if no other Team competes against them in Novice.
- 5. When moving up to the next Level of Competition; Team Members may hold the same Station as they held in Novice.
- 6. Teams must consist of Members who have never been in Competition before.
- 7. If you know of one on the Team who has competed previously, then to be fair to all Teams this should be brought quietly to the attention of the Ritual Chairman as soon as possible.
- 8. Teams must have a score of 85% or above to be eligible for Team or Individual Awards.
- 9. The Novice Class will have its own "All Stars".
- 10. Other than the above, Class "B" regular Rules are to be adhered to.
