## Information Regarding Provincial Presidents Special Charity



## Those Living With Cystic Fibrosis

Today there are approximately 4,000 Canadians battling this condition. Fifty years ago, infants born with CF weren't expected to live past childhood. Today, thanks to improvements in the treatment options and early screening, many Canadians born with CF can expect to live well into their 40's. Eight Provinces currently do regular CF screening of newborns so that those diagnosed can get treatment sooner. Despite the great progress we've made already, each week two children in Canada are diagnosed with CF and one person dies from it. There are countless ways you can offer your support, one being supporting PWP Michael and PMP Donnas' Provincial Special Charity.

## What Is Cystic Fibrosis

CF is a Genetic disorder that gets passed on from your parent's. Normally the mucus in our bodies is thin and slippery, which helps it clear out dirt and germs. People with CF are born with a defective Gene that causes this mucus to be unusually thick and sticky. As a result, the mucus isn't cleared out of the Lungs as quickly as it should be, and bacteria can collect, leading to repeated Lung infections. This cycle can damage the tissue in the Lungs and make it difficult to breath, and eventually a Lung transplant may be required. The mucus can also block the tubes of the Pancreas, an organ that releases enzymes to the stomach to break down the foods we eat. As a result, people with CF often have nutritional deficiencies because they can't digest and absorb their foods properly, leading to weight loss and problems with growth.

## How Is It Treated

Although there is currently no cure, treatment is available that focuses on the Lungs and the Digestive System. It includes inhaled medications to help loosen and thin the mucus and open the airways, and antibiotics to prevent or treat Lung infections. The basis for choosing the purchase of nebulizers for the BC Children's Hospital - Cystic Fibrosis Clinic is to reduce the time of treatment from 2.5 hours to 30 minutes a day. As children get older they do not want to give up 2 and a half hour of their day, even though they know it to their benefit. According to the Clinic the 10 - 18 year old age group tends to get more Lung infections due to skipping the treatment. The nebulizers will be made available to the families who cannot bear the expense.

On October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2016 the Fraternal Order of Eagles Chemainus Crofton #4400; representatives Ken Hamilton and Bill Yearley presented the Tour de Rock Team members with a cheque for \$1,500.00 for Pediatric Cancer Research and support Programs at the breakfast that was held at the Legion.

The Canadian Cancer Society Cops For Cancer Tour de Rock is a Fundraising Event that raises money for Pediatric Cancer Research and Support Programs for children with a history of Cancer.

Since 1998, more than 300 police officers have been named to the Tour de Rock Team, along with 41 others, including Childhood Cancer survivors, longtime Volunteers and members of the Media who tell their story.

A new Team is picked every year, and historically, only one person has ridden the Tour de Rock more than once. The men and women named to the Tour de Rock each year sacrifice a lot of their time during the seven months of their Tour experience. On top of Fundraising, Team Members train on their bikes three days a week — hill night, speed nights and long-distance endurance rides — to help prepare the team for the physical demands of the 1,100-kilometre, two-week ride.

What is harder to prepare for is the emotional side of the journey. Tour de Rock Team Members are paired with Members of our Junior Rider Team, a group of Vancouver Island children who have a history of Cancer. Some of them are currently fighting the disease and others are fortunately in remission, while there are also Junior Riders who are the sibling of a child who has lost their battle with Cancer. The stories of the Junior Riders are both troubling and inspiring for the Tour de Rock Team.

## **About Spinal Cord Injury BC**

A Spinal Cord Injury can happen to anyone at any time. There are many causes: a car accident, a shallow dive, a bad fall, a skiing or bike crash, an infection, a spinal tumor or cyst, and congenital condition, and more.

Spinal Cord Injury BC's programs and resources are here to help people with spinal cord injuries and their families adjust, adapt and thrive in their communities—whether they're coping with new injury or dealing with the ongoing challenge of living and aging with a physical disability.

We build Communities of Support - Peer to Peer Matches

Peer Program – Support Groups and Events; Info Line and Information Resources; Website (blog); The Spin Magazine; Scholarships

An unexpected injury can lead to social isolation, depression and withdrawal from active living. Many individuals with SCI find themselves without adequate support networks and are unable to find the information and resources they need to adjust, adapt and thrive in their new lives.

We have offices throughout the province—from Victoria + Nanaimo, to Prince George + Fort St John, to the Okanagan, and right here in Vancouver. And more!

SCI: Facts and Figures: More than 12,000 people in BC live with a SCI (86,000 in Canada). There are 500 new injuries each year in BC (4,300 in Canada) 51 % traumatic – 49 % non-traumatic; 80% are men; 49% are aged 60 or older (121,000SCI's projected by 2030 in Canada). Spinal *Cord* Injuries are emotionally and financially devastation

More than \$3.6 Billion per year – economic cost of new traumatic SCI in Canada \$1.6 to \$3 million – Estimated lifetime cost of living with a SCI in BC 60% of people with SCI are unemployed, but not unemployable.

If it was just about the walking, spinal cord injury would be easy. Most people would rather regain the following functions before walking such as hand function, sexual function and bowel and bladder function. We focus on quality of life

Most people with SCI cans still live unassisted, drive, play sports, sail skydive, bungee jump. They can have sex and children. They are able to work even though 60% are unemployed. People who use wheelchairs work as Mayors, MLAs, doctors and surgeons, photographers and filmmakers They can be construction foremen or entrepreneurs, etc.



## From BC Provincial Worthy Secretary Will Heigh and PPWP Gerry Acton:

## Are You Ready For British Columbia's New Societies Act

Effective November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016 the current Society Act (BC); will be repealed and replaced with the *Societies Act (BC) ("New Act")*. While maintaining much of the same basic not-for-profit framework that currently governs BC societies, the New Act significantly modernizes – for the first time since the 1970s – the governance regime to which BC societies are subject and introduces a number of new concepts.

All BC societies will have to actively transition to the New Act within two years of its in-force date; however, irrespective of whether this transition has been completed, many of the provisions contained in the New Act will apply as of November 28<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Therefore, it is in our best interest to make sure that our Aerie and Auxiliary Officers and Members become familiar with this new legislation as soon as possible.

## Key Features of the New Act:

- Structure of charter documents, Constitution and By-Laws, after transition the constitution only consists of the name of the society and the statement of its purposes.
- Before transitioning the society should ensure that the information on file about its directors and registered office on file with the registry is correct and up-to-date, and that you are up-to-date on your annual reports.
- Member-funded or not? If you receive funds from public donations or government funding, currently or possibly in the future, you may not qualify as member-funded. You will be asked this question in transitioning, so please understand how the question relates to you.
- Distribution of assets on winding up, this should be covered in your by-laws.

The above is not legal advice; it is only intended to provide information only of changes to the laws of the land in which we operate. The Provincial Aerie Executive is looking into this further and will provide any further information we can, however, we strongly urge you to make yourself aware of these changes and what you need to do to transition to the New Act. Transitioning, registry and updating will primarily be done on line.
