

If we all put in our usual enthusiastic efforts, it will be a marvelous and exciting term.

First, I'd like to congratulate Don Dixon of Hope #2690 and Barbara Bell of Abbotsford #2726 on their election as our new Provincial Trustees this year. We had a wonderful time at Convention in Vernon in June, and we send our thanks to their many volunteers and chairpersons for doing such a splendid job. Also, congratulations to Sister Joan Klit on her election as Provincial Madam Secretary; it's a tall order to follow our beloved Joanne Krisko in the job but, as usual, Joan will do an exemplary job.

Just as a quick reminder for you all, our next Conventions will be in Campbell River in 2019 and Cranbrook in 2020. For Aeries that want to host the Convention for 2021 or beyond, please refer to the Provincial By-Laws for the process. We're currently waiting on Grand Aerie to send back our approved Provincial By-Laws amended at Convention. Once we have them back, a copy will be on the website at <a href="www.bcfoe.com">www.bcfoe.com</a> and copies will be circulated to all Aeries and Provincial Executive members, past and present.

On the topic of By-Laws, we at Provincial this term will be helping any Aeries who want to get their Local Aerie By-Laws up to date, and we've circulated to the Local Aerie Secretaries in B.C. an electronic version of the Statutes for your Aerie's renewal of their Society Act registration. This term's Cursory Surveys, which will take place in EVERY Aerie in BC. These Surveys will be planned out during the Executive Session and each Aerie Secretary will be contacted to confirm the date of the visit of the Provincial Rep that will perform the Audit. A copy of the blank Audit form will be forwarded to each Aerie in advance of the date so that an internal check can be performed.

We invite every member in B.C. to attend the Autumn Executive Session (AES) will be at Penticton #4281 on Saturday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>. We would love to have a full room for the Session and every member in Good Standing is welcome, so come out and meet your Provincial Officers and bring any questions and ideas that you have. Let's make this as fun and productive as we can.

One particular reminder for the Aerie Secretaries in regard to Provincial Per Capita payments; on the Provincial Per Capita you can print from MMS and on which you base your payments, there is a line referring to the possible payment of per capita on Dual Members of your Aerie. The BC Provincial Aerie does not charge for Dual Members as part of its per capita – it ONLY charges for <u>Local Members in Good Standing</u>. Those of you who wrote in the number of Duals you have on your roster and paid for them on the November 30<sup>th</sup> invoice will be credited for those amounts on your May 31<sup>st</sup> invoice (payment due no later than June 30, 2019) – just deduct the Dual Members amount you paid for November 30<sup>th</sup> from the next invoice amount. Some Provincial/State Aeries charge for duals, but BC does not so in future please just ignore that line.

In the next issue of the Echo, I'll go over the recent Statute changes that took place at the Grand Convention in Dallas last month.

On the information front, we've compiled new information for Committee Chairmen and posted it on the Provincial Website's Resources page. There is a sample letter for Charity Chairmen to send out twice during the term to request the Local Aeries to host an event or two for their appointed charities.

The provincial website has its new look and is underway with its updates and new features. Provincial Trustee Dan Miner has done a wonderful job and if you want your Aerie/Auxiliary to have a site and pages on the Provincial site, just let Dan know and he can get you set up to post news and updates about your own Aerie & Auxiliary. 



Hello Sisters and Brothers; As Co - Chairman for Provincial Madam President Marilyn's Special Charity for this Term the BC Wheelchair Sports. I have some information about the BC Wheelchair Sports to share with you.

Once again, thank you so much to the Fraternal Order of Eagles for nominating BC Wheelchair Sports Association to be your charity of choice. In regards to information about our organization, I thought it was probably easiest to send you a link to our website which has all the information about when we were created (1971) and the sports we manage (wheelchair tennis, wheelchair athletics, wheelchair rugby), along with the events we manage (everything from participants first try at wheelchair sports through to hosting international tournaments), as well as our overall mission, vision and values.

I have had a discussion with my colleagues around where we see the most support needed for our programs and we have a few initial thoughts as below. Please let me know if any of these sound like they could be a good fit for what you like to fundraise for and / or if you would like more information (e.g. approximate budgets, quotes).

- <u>Equipment</u> we are always after new equipment to serve new participants as well for us to have in our wheelchair rental pool whereby BCWSA owns the equipment and for a very minimal fee rents it out to participants who would otherwise not be able to afford their own equipment.
- 'Bridging the Gap' Is our program we run in the community which works to bring new people in the community into our programs. We have definitely targeted programs for differing ages, disabilities etc. Some examples which may be of interest are our BTG Kids program which includes projects such as our annual junior multi-sports camp, junior tennis tournament, annual girls only camp, Have a Go days we run in conjunction with wheelchair basketball etc. As part of our BTG program we also run a weekly session at GF Strong rehab centre for inpatients and community members.
- Event contribution We run a number of regional, national and international events around Vancouver. These events help us to raise the profile of wheelchair sport in the region by attracting world class teams and players to the province to compete and given the community the opportunity to see these top athletes in action. We are always looking for support for these events and they provide a good opportunity for us to recognise your support through event signage and promotion. Examples of these include Wheelchair Tennis Summer Series, Wheelchair Tennis International Tournament (Kits Beach, Vancouver), Wheelchair Rugby Invitational Tournament (Richmond Olympic Oval), Canada Cup International Wheelchair Rugby Tournament (Richmond Olympic Oval).

Dear Members and Friends: Once again I wish to thank everyone who so willingly saved, collected, trimmed, sorted and delivered canceled stamps to help "STAMP OUT CANCER". Without your continued help and support we could not keep up our good work. A special thanks to the many businesses and organizations that help with our project.

The fund derived from the sale of cancelled stamps for the twelve month period ending April 30, 2017, enabled \$3,312.20 to be donated to cancer projects. This money is to be used either for research or cancer dressings; wherever it is needed. The need for dressings is still great so please help by telling your friends about this worthwhile cause.

Monies allocated to the Dressing Station Fund provide materials to the various dressing stations throughout the Province. These stations are manned by volunteers and many types of dressing are made and are supplied to any Cancer patient at no charge.

# You were asking:

1. Do I save personalized stamps? Will they take metered mail stamps?

Their response: All stamps from Canada Post are good, even the personalized ones. Sometimes, they are worth more money for us. Unfortunately, metered mail is still not saleable from our end. Foreign stamps are also very good. We get more money for these, depending on condition and age.

Please don't forget to leave a good margin around the stamps.

Note: Cutting off the end of envelope seemed worked well last year as a lot less stamps were wasted!!

2. If an Eagles Member needs bandages, how do they get them through this program?

#### Their response:

About the bandages - yes, they are totally free for <u>any</u> Cancer patient. The patient is supposed to get a letter from their family doctor, or Cancer Doctor, in order to access them. It is a bit difficult to access them, because over the years; things in the care of Cancer patients has changed. It used to be that each Cancer Dressing Station had access to the Public Health Office in their community, which had an autoclave for sterilizing. However, the autoclaves have been removed from the PH offices, so our access to sterilization is now through the hospitals. So now, please get in touch with a Chapter of Eastern Star, who can get in touch with me to authorize the dressings to be allocated. I am currently working with the BC Cancer Agency to streamline this process, if possible. Stacey, Director of Cancer Activities
