



Applications shall be submitted to the Provincial Madam Secretary who will then pass this onto the Chairman of the Committee prior to the **deadline of May 1**st to be considered for presentation at the Provincial Convention. Applications will be held for a period of three (3) years with automatic reviewing each year.
