





Questions and Answers

Q - Is a Treasurer supposed to give a report at an Auxiliary Meeting?

A - YES; Section 14.4 of the Rules and Regulations states in part; The Madam Treasurer shall keep such records, books and accounts, and make such reports as may be prescribed by the Grand Aerie.

Q - Can a Member resign her Membership?

A - YES; **Section 6.1** of the Rules and Regulations states; Any member of any Auxiliary who is in good standing and against whom no charges are pending may, without the payment of any fee, resign her membership in the Auxiliary and her membership in the Auxiliary shall forthwith cease upon presentation of such resignation to any regular meeting of the Auxiliary. Upon her resignation, she must return her Official Receipt to the Secretary.

Q - Can she then re-affiliate with another Auxiliary?

A - Section 6.2 of the Rules and Regulations states; Any member of an Aerie or Auxiliary who has resigned her membership and who desires to re-affiliate in any Aerie or Auxiliary may not do so for twelve (12) months and must do so as a new member.

Questions and Answers

Q - When the officers have their meeting minutes must be recorded are they also not to be read at our regular meeting?

A - NO; It is not included in the Ritual of the Ladies Auxiliary under Order of Business. **Section 7.5** of the Rules and Regulations states; The Ritual of the Ladies Auxiliary, and instructions therein contained shall be considered part of the Rules and Regulations.

Q - When there is an Officer Meeting are the Officers allowed to decide what correspondence get's brought to the Auxiliary meeting.

A - NO; Section 3.4 (a) of the Rules and Regulations states; The purpose of an officers meeting is to permit an exchange of views between the officers as to the needs of the Auxiliary and to arrange for an orderly discharge of business at the regular meeting, and to make plans for membership programs and other Auxiliary activities for the submission to the membership. And Section 3.4 (b) of the Rules and Regulations states; The transaction of business such as incurring expenses or authorizing the payment of bills cannot lawfully be conducted at an officers meeting, but must be included on the agenda at a regular meeting of the Auxiliary when the membership can have a voice and vote thereon. And Section 13.1 of the Rules and Regulations states in part of the duty of the Madam Secretary; It shall be her duty to read to the Auxiliary all reports, bills and communications which may be presented, including all official communications received from the Grand Aerie, which shall be read in their entirety unless otherwise specifically directed.

Q – Are there any grey areas to our Rules and Regulations?

A – NO; The following is what every Auxiliary should adhere **Section 36.1** of the Rules and Regulations states; Unless otherwise specifically stated by the Rules and Regulations or by the or the By-Laws of the Auxiliary, "Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised," shall control parliamentary procedures.

Q – Can the Interviewing Committee withdraw the name of an applicant for membership?

A – NO: Section 1.6 of the Rules and Regulations states in part; "The Interviewing Committee may not withdraw if the applicant is found unfavorable. Only the proposer, or applicant, can withdraw the application before the report of the Interviewing Committee to the Auxiliary." As for the Interviewing Committee they are to give a report of the interview and no recommendation. A report is not we have interviewed the candidate. A report is a statement of facts from the interview. This was verified by Creighton A. Thurman, Esq. Grand Aerie Legal Adviser/General Counsel

INSTRUCTIONS:

Applications to be submitted by local Auxiliaries on the application form attached. Applications must contain all facts and dates of service to assist the committee in their selections. Applications may be submitted by an Auxiliary, signed and sealed by the Madam President and the Madam Secretary. They may also be submitted by at least two (2) Past Provincial Madam Presidents or two (2) Hall of Fame members, and signed by these proposers.

There will be four (4) selections with no more than two (2) being deceased.

Applications shall be submitted to the Chairman of the committee prior to the deadline of May 1st to be considered for presentation at the Provincial Convention. Applications will be held for a period of three (3) years with automatic reviewing each year.

ADMINISTRATION:

The Provincial Madam President shall appoint the Hall of Fame committee from the Past Provincial Madam Presidents and the Hall of Fame members.
